

FOR THE LOVE OF PONTIAC

My wife and I were living in Saylorsburg, PA, north of Allentown, and in late 2012, I picked up a '70 Bonneville two-door hardtop in New Jersey with a 455 in it and I parked it for a future project. I wanted it mostly for the engine. In April 15, 2013, I went to look at a '41 Pontiac somewhere down outside of the Philadelphia area. The gentleman who owned it had sandblast the whole car, including the wind glass and he had it all apart. I think he was tired of working on it. He said he had invested \$10,000 in it so far and I could have it for \$3000. He had installed the fat man front end with four-wheel disc brakes, rack and pinion steering, and a Ford 9 inch rear also with disc brakes. My wife said that was a good price so we brought it home and I started building the car.

I decided to paint it with a heavy amount of metallic. Also, I wanted the car to be black, but when the sun shone on it, it was all the colors of the rainbow and as you walked around the car the color changed. This meant three coats of black paint, three coats of pearl and four coats of clear. I also did the roof in a silver pearl. In went the 455 from the '70 and added new KM lifters and 24 barrel intake with two 500 CFM Eldebrock carburetors. However, when you put the Pontiac engine in the steering column is in the way, so the older cars steering wheel was not really centered under the speedometer. When I moved it over to the left directly under the speedometer, I could fit the engine in the car The next problem was exhaust. Edmond Headers in California made me a custom set of headers. I had an old set of side pipes that I had purchased at Carlisle back in the 70s and decided to put them on the car. I always wanted Cragar SS wheels, so that had to happen. In 2014 it was on the road. I also put vintage air in it and completely redid the dashboard with a hand painted wood grain on the dash.

For years I could not find somebody to do the interior. I had it a couple different places and never got done, At the last place that I took the seats to the owner stole part of my material, so I said the heck with it. I went out and bought a sewing machine and did it myself. These old Pontiacs were called Silver Streaks because, from 1935 through 1954 they had a silver streak down the hood. I decided to put a silver streak all the way around the interior of the car, across the door panels, across the backseat and then the door panels in the other side, I wanted some kind of emblem on the seats, so I searched through the Internet and decided to go with the emblem that went on the front radiator cowl of a '34 Pontiac as a pattern. I had the design embroidered into the red material for my seats. I also wanted to have a Pontiac emblem on the door panels, so I drafted up a drawing, cut it out in cardboard, traced it onto the material, and sewed it into the door panels, finally in 2024. Oh, In the midst of all this, in 2020, we moved to North Carolina, but the seats were finally done.

The first car show I went to with it I received a trophy. I have had over100 Pontiacs and I restored Pontiac for other people (including striping and painting Dick Stover's '48). Having moved to North Carolina, I thought I would slow down, but I still can't stop. I did two cars for two customers down here and built two more for myself. I always wanted a '58, so finally found a '58 Pontiac two-door hardtop Chiefain Catalina for my new project. BTW, it's a Tri-power,






Before and after pictures in my 41 Pontiac 2012 2014




